Gossip

This year's was the 50th running of the **Little 500** bike race at Indiana University, Bloomington. Film buff bikies recognize **the race from that classic, *Breaking Away***. There was a huge feature article in *USA Today* on April 7, and a nice radio feature in National Public Radio's *All Things Considered* April 13 all, of course, because of the cinematic tie-in. The radio piece was **an interview with Dave Blase**, the model for *Breaking Away*'s **fictional Dave Stohler** — a young man infatuated with racing and **Being Italian**. **Blase wasn't pretending to be Italian**, but when the film's writer-to-be and fellow racer, Steve Tesich, first encountered him on a training ride, **Blase was singing an aria from *Rigoletto*** while tackling one of the many hills in the Bloomington area. Another inspiration for the film's story was Blase's **performance at the 1962 Little 500 race**. The real-life Dave rode **139 laps of the 200** in the race — something that had never been done before — spiriting his frat's team (No, the Real Dave wasn't a "Cutter.") to victory and becoming the "**most influential rider**" in Little 500 history. Tesich, by the way, was one of Blase's teammates.

This year's Lake Metroparks Bike Expo was a nice experience. **More than 600 attended** the annual celebration of the coming of Bike Season, this year at **Lake Farmpark**. Now there's an interesting facility! The Farmpark is a place where city folk can come and enjoy learning about agriculture — bib overalls optional. We'd love to see the expo one day encompass a whole weekend — with bike tours and races! **Atta-Boy to Bill Plessinger and Lake Metroparks!**

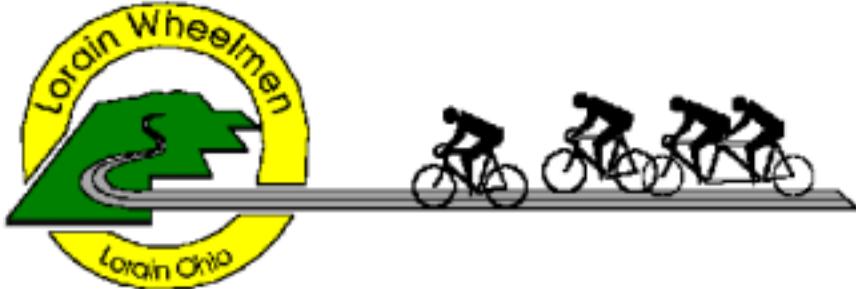
Change is afoot at Western Reserve Cycle Sport! Owner **Doug Anderson** has



World Cycling News

BRUSSELS (April 6) - German rider Erik Zabel will not seek retribution against Tin-Tin, the pony who unseated him during a Ghent-Wevelgem race.

Zabel, among a leading pack in the 208-kilometer event, was knocked off his bike when two ponies — Tin-Tin and Deesse — broke loose from their paddock and charged into the riders about 75 kilometers from the finish.

After jumping a wooden gate the ponies, whose owner said were normally docile beasts, felled three riders and dumped Zabel into a ditch.

They then sprinted along with the leading pack for about 2-1/2 kilometers before being diverted by race organizers. Zabel, who won last month's Milan-San Remo World Cup classic and was one of the pre-race favorites for Ghent-Wevelgem, saw the funny side of the incident.

"Out of respect for the ponies I shan't be lodging any formal complaint. Luckily, I haven't got any cuts and bruises," he said.

This was not the first time animals have featured in the event. Last year, Belgium's Ludo Dierckxsens crashed into an unfortunate rabbit.

Wednesday's race was won by the unfancied Farm Frites rider Geert Van Bondt of Belgium in just over five hours.





Bicycling Magazine's Joe Kurmaskie and Adventure Cycling Association's Willie Weir, Everyman travelers everyone will relate to, teamed up for a 30+ city national tour. They visited the Borders store in Beachwood April 15. The audience enjoyed an entertaining hour and 15 minutes not of readings from their books, but of the writers' stories and performance antics.

Their show has been called "a captivating hour of storytelling, theater and back-and-forth banter in the style of National Public Radio's 'Car Talk' brothers Click and Clack."

The national tour comes on the heels of the hardcover releases of their books *Spokesongs*, and *Metal Cowboy* by Breakaway Books.

Weir's tales from journeys throughout India, South Africa and the Balkans are spun in *Spokesongs: Bicycle Adventures on Three Continents*. Rick Steves, internationally renowned travel guide and writer says, "Reading Willie Weir is like bouncing along on the back of his bike, hanging tight to this poet/guide who knows just which potholes offer the most travel thrills and hits them expertly."

From the moment an old blind rancher in Pocatello, Idaho, tapped his cane over Joe and the loaded touring bike, stood back, and said, "Ah, metal cowboy," the quest had a name. *Metal Cowboy: Tales From the Road Less Pedaled*, Kurmaskie's critically praised collection of stories, captures adventures, trials and triumphs far off the prescribed roadways of life. It's been called "a delightful excursion" by *Booklist*, and compared to the writings of Bill Bryson.

Sponsored by *Bicycling* magazine, Ortlieb, and the Adventure Cycling Association, their six-week book tour, began on April 3, in Minneapolis, will span the country (in a van, not via bicycle) with more than 30 stops, from San Diego to Boston.

Kurmaskie and Weir first met at Seattle's Bicycle Expo last year and soon discovered they had everything in common except birth parents. Long, lonely book tours can take their toll on authors, so the two decided to team up for a west coast tour in the fall of '99. They packed book stores from Washington to California, traveling with the motto, "Are we still having fun?"

After hearing this funny, wise and completely original duo perform (and we do mean perform) stories from their books *Metal Cowboy & Spokesongs*, audiences realize that adventure and off-the-beaten path experiences are not that far out of reach for anyone.

Yes. They are most definitely still having fun.

A Letter From Vetter...

THE MAIDEN VOYAGE: A.F.R.O.S.T. & S.O.B.: This title doesn't mean what you think. Today I rode my new bicycle on the Lorain Wheelmen's Ride – AFROST. I have a new bike, a new seat, but the Same Old Butt (SOB).

Last year you may or may not remember my struggle to complete the Columbus Fall Challenge. I felt I needed a triple crank to ride that one again. For Christmas I got my triple crank attached to a new Bianci Eros. It's a sweet riding light touring bike and today I rode it for the first time. Tom and I drove up to meet Scott, Tim, and Jeannie for the ride. The ride offered four distances to choose from and started in Amherst, Ohio. The temperature was a nippy forty-something with chilling Northerly winds coming in off Lake Erie. Tom and I started out early on the sixty-two mile route and my seat was painful from the first pedal stroke (SOB). I've been using a leather saddle for 22 years and it has conformed to my anatomy. I can ride on that seat all day and most of the night with comfort. Despite our head start Tom and I were soon caught from behind by Tim and Jeannie on the tandem followed by Scott and a new friend who has been racing in that State up North. Tom and I jumped on the back of the pace line and drafted to Wellington where we all stopped at McDonald's for breakfast and a chance to sit on something other than a bike seat (SOB). During our little break I realized that my legs were sore too.

The route down to Wellington was what I might call snakelike. That is, we rode east then west, back and forth, as we progressed Southward. We crossed over Quarry Road three times. After breakfast in Wellington the route was pretty much straightforward back to Amherst with that Northerly wind in our faces. There were three of us who dropped off the pace-line, actually I never made it back on the pace-line and Tom and one other fellow dropped off to keep me company (Nice Guys). As we grouped together we decided that the sixty-two route was a little too long for us. I like the way these guys think and we took the fifty-mile option. You see, the 50- and 62-mile routes were the same up where we cross over Rt. 303 and besides my seat was killing me (SOB). All in all it was a great day for a bike ride with the exception of having a new seat to ride on (SOB).

This not a commercial for Brookes or Ideale saddles but I do prefer them to the lightweight racing saddles that come with most bikes today. Over breakfast we observed that some of the expensive bikes come without pedals to allow the purchaser to select a pedal that they prefer to use. It seems funny to say that my bike was not expensive enough to come without pedals. It came with Look pedals and I bought Shimano pedals to use with it. Next will be a new leather saddle (SOB).

Getting a Jump on the Weather

I'm sure there were more of you out there, but I may be having hallucinations that come from the **LOSS (Lack Of Sun Shine)** that plagues so many of us living in this neck of the woods. Don't Go "Bonkers" On Us
